"Inauguration Ceremony of orientation Programme



Sri Himanta Biswa Sarma, Chief Guest and Sri Ram Madhav, Guest of Honour, inaugurated the first Orientation Programme of Royal Global University (RGU) on 26 July 2017. Sri Himanta Biswa Sharma, Minister for Education, Health, Finance, Tourism, GDD, Pension & Public Grievances & P&D, talked about as RGU was being inaugurated, he sees a change with golden letters in the chapters of India with the beautiful beginning of Royal Global University. He was amazed by the fact that massive changes has come along in the field of higher education with the advent of a number of medical colleges, engineering institutes and private universities. Assam in education has also changed in the last 6-7 years. There has been 6-12 medical colleges and the IIT's, Central University, 17 engineering colleges, TISS, IIIT and a whole lot of opportunity has come up to have a newer Assam. Assam is bound to change in great heights ten years down the lane. He aspires for Assam being a centre of medical tourism of South-East Asia, centre of higher education, commercial hub of South-east Asia in the future to come and be the global leader. He pointed out that the younger generation should have inquisitiveness, should be in tune with the global implication of the changes that take place in the world. He vehemently commented that Assam can withstand the burden of any short comings, sorrows, miseries and calamities. He further suggested that the curriculum should infuse the learning of Assamese and Sanskrit which in turn will make the students aware of the richness of Assamese and Sanskrit literature. Community Service is the need of the hour.

There has been major change in the education sector over the years and at present there has been a major transformation, the statistics have changed. He further talked about the "ACT EAST" policy of our PM and talked about the major happenings in Assam in terms of tie-ups,

constructions, events etc. He feels confident that Assam 15-20 years down the line will be comparable to Maharashtra, Karnataka and TN, stating that he sees RGU as a south Asian university and not just a state university in the years to come. He talked about the opening of consulate offices in Assam and feels the need to broaden our vision and our life has to be full of hope and positivity and the agitational mindset has to go. We should strive towards giving back to the centre the best of our state, be it as young leaders, in education etc. Assam should be the leader of future India & RGU should focus on that. Assam requires new ideas and thought process & the next generation is responsible for that and so is our educational institutes. We have to take the lead to take our state forward. Educational institutes should make it necessary for the students to be tuned to the latest happenings. We are yet to build our state universities as a knowledge hub. RGU can be the leader in the intellectual field. He further requested the management to include subjects on Assamese and Sanskrit that will help to reinvent the state. It is our responsibility to imbibe our roots and values to our children.



Sri Ram Madhav, National General Secretary, BJP, at the outset said he sincerely congratulated the members of the RGU for their efforts to shape up this budding university, Royal Global University (RGU). He stressed on the fact that the burden of higher education should be shared with the government and in relation to this he appreciated the efforts of Sri A.K. Pansari to do so. He opined that we are in the digital era today and applauded the administration and management department of the RGU for setting up such a fantastic futuristic arena for the students. He further highlighted the idea of 'Man- Making' wherein three things are needed for the same. 'Men' making implies character building. It's not about gender but about human being in general.



We should make our country great with our values and righteousness and feel respected even outside our country. He said the Government wishes to spend much on primary education and all the leading educationists should come forward and join hands for Education should be for the good and not as a business as the 21st century is changing very fast, the whole world is transforming at a very fast pace & as we embark on areas like education, we need to focus on a futuristic approach. Education as a whole is changing, new modules are being introduced, digitization etc. The future of education will get to see online tutors and mentors. RGU administrative body should be credited for building such a futuristic foundation where every student has today multiple channels of information, focus should be on building ideas, innovation, research, Future should not be of degrees but about skills and innovation. He further said Patriotism is a natural instinct. He said that 3 things are required for man making--Pride in the past, Pain about the present and Dream about the future - focus more on great dreams and not mundane ones and the ones that focusses your nation and not just yourself.He concluded by saying that - The nation has to be made great by our efforts and not just by ourselves and be respected as an Indian, only then we will feel connected to our roots. He further stressed on being rooted to our values and ethics.

Sri A.K. Pansari, Honourable Chancellor, RGU addressed the gathering with his inspring words talked about the 8 years journey and completion of The Royal Knowledge Park. He further pointed out the problem of exodus of the students from the state. He emphasized on the fact that one should act east, study east, work in east and be a contributor to the state. He spoke about employability, academic excellence and out of box thinking. He appreciated the sate

leader, Dr. Himanta Biswa Sharma and national leader Sri Ram Madhav in relation to their efforts made to turn the tables in the political scenario of the nation and also stressed that 'Dignity of Labour' is given much importance in the RGU campus.
