

The Genesis

The Genesis of the Assam Royal Global University is in the formation of the Gyan Sagar Foundation (GSF), a not-for-profit organization, in the year 2008 with the objective of spreading quality education in thecountry. The GSF established The Royal Group of Institutions (RGI) in 2009, which offered graduate and postgraduate courses in Engineering, Management, Architecture and Commerce. In 2012, the GSF founded the Royal Global School. The foundation moved ahead in its mission to spread the benefit of education and advance of knowledge by establishing the Assam Royal Global University (RGU) through an act of the government of Assam in 2013 (established by the Assam Royal Global University Act No. XXIII 2013). The establishment of the Assam Royal Global University completed the vision of the Gyan Sagar Foundation to extend education within the entire range from pre-primary to tertiary- from KG to PG. Having created the basic infrastructures, RGU began its teaching, learning and research programs from 2017. The Assam Royal Global University completed its first NAAC accreditation on 9th December 2024, earning a B++ grade with a score of 2.94, reflecting its commitment to academic excellence.



Academic Programs





RGU offers a wide range of courses at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels numbering over 167 under 130 programs through 22 Schools of Studies. The Courses are contemporary, and also futuristic, developed against the perspectives of the projections and anticipated needs for human resources in the wake of Industry 5.0 and Education 5.0. The Academic Philosophy underpinning these courses and programs is that of the spirit of the liberal art education incorporating multidisciplinarity, flexibility, diversity, and holistic development. The University has implemented the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) in the year 2023 effecting necessary statutory amendments.



During the year 2024-2025 RGU has introduced the following new courses:



Artificial Intelligence & Data Science

The undergraduate program leading to B. Tech in Artificial Intelligence and Data Science, approved by the AICTE, has been developed in the context of the pervasive application of Machine Learning, Deep Learning, and Data Science in almost every domain of human knowledge and activities. With the explosive growth in research, there has been an unbelievable volume of data generation in almost every field — from astrophysics to architecture and from bioinformatics to business economics. The growing necessity of a multidisciplinary approach involving mathematics, statistics, and computer science to store, curate, retrieve, analyze, and infer the huge datasets has made it imperative to develop this undergraduate program in Artificial Intelligence and Data Science.



Forestry

Climate change, global warming, pollution, and species loss have brought to the fore the fundamental importance of the ecological role played by forests. Understanding this role with the implicit science of forestry, the dynamics of forest in ecology, sociology, culture, economics and politics call for comprehensive study. Forestry is central to the issue of the sustainability of our planet and human survival.

Pedagogy

Digital technology has been a boon to the world of education during the pandemic of COVID-19. Digital technology, a disruptive technology, enabled us to offset the disruption coming in the wake of the pandemic. There has been mind-boggling development in Computer Science, Information Technology, Robotics and Satellite Technology. Students of the present generation are adept at these technologies. These technologies are making access to information and knowledge unbelievably fast and easy. The all- The pervasive technology of Artificial Intelligence (AI) is a double-edged sword. While digital technology with the latest versions of AI have already become an integral part of pedagogy, there are challenges in exciting, stimulating and enabling the students to think-think critically, and come up with creative problem-solving abilities. Against this perspective, at RGU we are incorporating innovative pedagogic models in addition to the conventional classroom centric, generally monologic discourses. Flipped classrooms, experiential learning, capstone projects, internships, excursions and field studies, workshops, and other alternative modes of pedagogy have been embraced in the academic system of RGU. These alternative pedagogic mechanisms include the Institution Innovation Council (ICC), Internship and Dissertation Work, Students' Clubs, National Cadet Corps (NCC), and the National Service Scheme (NSS). These are some of the organisational units in the University through which we endeavour towards inculcating the critical elements of education to the young students. Critical thinking through independent observation, analysis, hypothesization, and experimentation, discipline, time management, empathy, resilience, organic bonding with nature, commitment, social responsibility, patriotism, and many other attributes, values and virtues- central to education can be inculcated and inducted in the young minds through the activities under these units.







Institution Innovation Council

RGU has the Institution Innovation Council (ICC) formed under the aegis of the Minister Education Government of India. The IIC organised a number of events during the year on innovation and entrepreneurship outreach program workshop on innovative kinetics culture for commercialisation, AICTE Innovation, Design and Entrepreneurship (IDE) bootcamp organised under the aegis of the ministry of education, DoSEL, AICTE, NCERT, and PMSHRI, workshop on business model canvas, Intellectual Property Rights, exposure visits to technology driven business summit, internal hackathon, etc.

Through experiential learning opportunities, students gain practical exposure to industry practices, critical thinking skills, develop contribute meaningfully ongoing academic and professional research.


Key Research Highlights

The Academic Year 2024–2025 marked a period of remarkable growth and consolidation of research excellence at RGU. Across disciplines, there was a significant upsurge in diversescholarly outputs including publications, extramurally funded research projects and patents reaffirming RGU's position as a vibrant hub for innovation and knowledge creation.

1. Research Publications


The University recorded a remarkable surge in research productivity during the Academic Year 2024–2025, with total publications rising sharply to 360, compared to 196 in 2022–2023 and 172 in 2023–2024, indicating a strong upward trajectory in scholarly output. Of these, 171 publications were in peer-reviewed journals, 152 were indexed in Scopus, and 38 appeared in Web of Science (WOS), reflecting both diversity and quality of research.





2. Research Funding and Sponsored Projects


The number of externally funded projects at RGU increased markedly during AY 2024–2025, reaching 12 active projects, up from 6 in 2023–2024 and 3 in 2022–2023, reflecting a fourfold increase over two years. These projects were supported by major national funding agencies, including DBT, DST, ICMR, AICTE, ICSSR, and BIRAC, demonstrating the




University's growing recognition in the national research landscape.

3. Innovation, Patents, and Translational Research

A significant rise was recorded in innovation-driven outcomes during AY 2024–2025, reflecting RGU's strong emphasis on translational and applied research. The total number of patents increased sharply to 64, compared to 34 in 2023–2024 and 15 in 2022–2023, demonstrating steady progress in intellectual property creation. For the period July 2024–July 2025, a total of 74 patents were filed, of which 35 were granted, showcasing tangible







research-to-innovation conversion.

4. Consultancy Projects

During the Academic Year 2024–2025, RGU hasstreamlined and strengthened its ConsultancyPolicy, resulting in a significant rise in consultancy engagements across diverse domains. Within a single year, the University successfully secured 07 consultancy projects, reflecting growing academic–industry collaboration and societal outreach.

Sustainability at Royal Global University

Royal Global University (RGU) is steadfast in its commitment to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through education, research, and sustainable campus practices. RGU commissioned a 1 MW on-grid solar power system, generating clean energy and reducing its carbon footprint. The University also planted around 5,000 trees and established a vermicomposting unit to convert organic waste into nutrient-rich compost. These initiatives underscore RGU's unwavering dedication to sustainability and its vision of fostering an environmentally responsible campus.











Royal Centre for Corporate Relations (RCCR)

The Assam Royal Global University believes in making its students ready for life, endowing them with professional skills to tackle challenges they may face not just during the days of their academic life at the university, but beyond; such as in industries and organizational workspaces. Students are trained and guidance is provided through several avenues to equip them for fulfilling careers.

The Royal Centre for Corporate Relations is a unit that provides career counseling to students as well as connects several companies and organizations to the student community, by inviting the former for orientation programmes as well as recruitment and placement drives. Besides focusing on academic rigor, students are engaged in interactive sessions with corporates, industrial visits, workshops on in-demand skills, research paper presentations and are encouraged to participate in management competitions. Regular interactions with alumni are arranged to acquaint the students with situations their seniors faced in the past. In addition to job placement support, RCCR also facilitates internships for students in various Government, semi-government and private organizations as a part of the course curricula. Strong industry interface whereby potential employers in industry are contacted at regular intervals and recruitment processes are conducted on or off campus as per recruiter's requirements.

Royal Centre for Human Resource Development (RCHRD)

A wide range of academic, developmental, and professional programmes were organized to enhance the institutional environment and individual capacities of faculty, staff, and students. The academic year began with the Faculty Colloquium-2024, which brought together nearly 300 faculty members on a collaborative platform to exchange research insights, strengthen interdisciplinary dialogue, and share best practices in teaching and scholarship.

In January 2025, a two-day workshop on Intellectual Property Rights sharpened understanding of patents, trademarks, and copyrights, ensuring researchers could safeguard innovations. This was followed by the FDP on Research Methodology in February, which provided faculty with advanced techniques for designing, analyzing, and presenting research. In March, a Management Development Programme (MDP) for employees of the Assam Postal Circle improved workplace efficiency and professional capability, while another FDP on Advanced Pedagogy upgraded teaching delivery with innovative classroom strategies.

April featured a one-week FDP on Pharmaceutical Innovation, which promoted academia-industry collaboration, alongside an interactive Fulbright session, informing participants about fellowships and international opportunities. Workshops in May on ShodhChakra, IRINS, and MOOC course development empowered faculty to leverage digital platforms for research networking and online learning. In June, a week-long FDP on NEP 2020 emphasized multidisciplinarity, innovation, and indigenous knowledge integration in education.

Collectively, these initiatives enriched academic culture, improved research competencies, fostered innovation, and strengthened institutional capacity for excellence.







Office of the International Affairs

The Office of International Affairs (OOIA) continues to serve as a key interface between the University and its International stakeholders. The office undertakes activities related to international student acquisition, participation in global education fairs, and coordination with overseas consultants and education departments to strengthen global outreach.

For incoming International students, the OOIA provides comprehensive arrival and settlement support including airport pickup, SIM card facilitation, bank account setup, FRRO registration, visa renewal assistance, ERP registration, and orientation services. In addition, the office extends continuous support through medical assistance,

NSS

The Assam Royal Global University, through its National Service Scheme (NSS) initiatives, has consistently undertaken meaningful activities to strengthen its engagement with the community and enhance student participation in social responsibility. The adopted villages (Lokhra, Pamohi, Deuchutal, Tetelia and Pub-Boragaon) has served as an important platform where students and faculty members jointly engage in programs designed to promote health, education, environmental sustainability, and awareness-building.

Centre for Interdisciplinary study and Research



Academic Resources

Central Library



Beyond resource provision, the library plays a vital role in promoting information literacy and research culture. Services such as monthly book displays, current awareness alerts, reprographic facilities, and inter-library loans foster a dynamic learning environment. The Advisory Committee, chaired by the Vice-Chancellor, ensures continuous improvement and alignment with academic goals. As RGU advances in academic and research excellence, the Central Library remains a hub of knowledge, fostering reading habits, supporting innovation, and guiding the university community toward lifelong learning. The library has a robust policy on plagiarism in alignment with the ethical guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC). Towards effective practice of this policy and for preventing plagiarism, the library has effective software like Drill Bit.

A central library, which is going to be a robust Academic Resource Centre of the University with a total floor area of 60,000 square feet is being developed and will be commissioned next year.

The Central Library of RGU is the academic backbone of the institution as it provides comprehensive learning and research resources to the students, scholars and the faculty members. Spread over an area of 5,000 square feet, the library houses 32,862 volumes and 10,854 titles, comprising textbooks, reference works, dissertations, and Ph.D. theses. RGU has a subscription to 79 print journals, 17 magazines, newspapers, ensuring access to both global and local knowledge sources. The library has fully embraced digitization, offering access to over 3,56,426 e-journals and 5,41,413 e-books through databases such as JSTOR, and Manupatra. A dedicated DELNET. e-library corner, digital repository (DSpace), and research archive (E-prints) enhance accessibility for students and researchers. The library is fully automated with Koha ILMS, enabling seamless circulation, remote logins, mobile OPAC services, and user-oriented innovations such as QR code access, e-news clippings, and online renewal systems.









Resources at RGU

The Assam Royal Global University houses several state-of-the-art specialized laboratories that enhance experiential learning, research excellence, and innovation across diverse disciplines. Museum

The Museum at the Royal Global University is an attempt to set up an art gallery for displaying valuable artefacts showcasing the rich cultural and natural heritage of the Northeastern region. The objective of the main museum collection which reflects the varied attractions of the eight Northeastern states, is to provide informal knowledge to the youth through a feeling of joy in gaining new experiences in a refreshing environment.

The handicrafts produced by each of the eight states in the region and displayed in the museum, bear the imprint of the religious beliefs and practices of the indigenous communities and form an integral part of their culture and economy. Folk art specimens made of like medium clay, various wood, bamboo, leather, bark, bone, horn and metal, display objects such as dress, headgears, ornaments, weapons, baskets, masks and ritualistic cult paintings in the museum. Weaving has been a traditional art in all the Northeastern states where silkworm rearing had been developed in an indigenous manner, most groups having excellent taste in colour an combinations.

Geographically, the Northeast is part of a great rain forest and a large number of the species of flora and fauna that are native to Southeast Asia, are also found in the eight States of Northeast India.

It is also hoped to raise an awareness and provide scope for educational activities for the students, both indoors and outdoors.



The Royal Astronomical Observatory

The Royal Astronomical Observatory (RAO) at The Assam Royal Global University serves as a gateway to the cosmos, inspiring students, researchers, and enthusiasts to explore the universe. It stands as a beacon of scientific curiosity and innovation, reflecting the university's dedication to astronomical education and research. The observatory advanced houses two 8-inch including instruments, Newtonian telescopes for deep sky explorations and astrophotography, and a 4-inch refractor for beginners. Regular skygazing sessions are being organized for students, researchers, and curious observers worldwide.







Fine Arts Gallery

Fine arts present a window for the expression of human experiences with the finest sensibilities. The Fine Arts department of RGU offers courses leading to the Bachelors, Masters and the Ph.D levels in Fine Arts, where, in addition to the intellectual aspects of the subject, the inherent skills of our students are honed. Nestled between the serene and pristine backdrop of the hills of Meghalaya, Garbhanga Forest, Deepor Beel- a Ramsar site, The Assam Royal Global University (RGU) has developed its moderninfrastructure at Betkuchi, Guwahati on the National Highway 37. Spreads across 27 acres with abuilt-up area of 12 lakh square feet, the sprawling campus is equipped with state-of-the-artacademic, administrative, residential, and recreational facilities, designed to foster holistic learningand development. All classrooms are ICT-enabled, with select rooms equipped with lecture capturing systems. The University maintains well-equipped laboratories for practical and research activities, supported by a dedicated animal house and a Nethouse-cum-Botanical Garden. The barrier-free campus houses a 350-seater auditorium, a 700-capacity multi-purpose hall, eightmodern seminar halls, and an amphitheatre. Amenities include multi-cuisine food courts, audio-visual studio, art gallery, museum, diagnostic and radiology laboratories, physiotherapy OPD, and ATM there are five hostels for boys and girls, along with a guest house, ample parking, uninterrupted power supply, health centre with DG backup, ambulance service, and a fleet of buses for studentsand staff. Comprehensive indoor and outdoor sports facilities include courts for badminton, tabletennis, squash, snooker, football, and basketball. The gymnasium, located within the hostels, isequipped with modern fitness machines and guided by certified trainers. The entire campus is under CCTV surveillance, supported by fire safety systems, and maintainedthrough adequate budgetary provisions for infrastructure upkeep and enhancement. During the year under consideration, the University has commissioned its ultramodern academicBlocks G, H, and I, with spaces for the faculty members of the Royal Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences, Linguistics, Travel, Tourism and Hotel Management and Food Science and Dietetics. These blocks also built the infrastructure for Faculty and Student Lounge, NCC and NSS units, the Royal Centre for Corporate Relations, office of the Dean, Students Welfare. 





